


Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs) **Awareness Month**

Screenings for sexually transmitted infections (STIs) and cervical cancer help teens and young adults stay healthy. STIs can lead to short-term health issues like urinary tract infections and long-term health issues like infertility, cervical cancer and even death. STI rates for chlamydia and gonorrhea continue to rise in the state of Texas. Therefore, health experts strongly encourage teens to get sexual health screenings beginning at the age of 16. The best options for ruling out STIs are getting an STI screening, cervical cancer screening, and/or a pap smear during your routine checkup.






